TRAFFIC TRIAL INFORMATION

COURT TRIAL: (non-jury)

A court trial for a Traffic Infraction is a hearing whereby the issuing officer and the defendant appear in court to offer testimony and present all relative evidence to support their case. The judge will issue a decision based on the facts presented at this hearing.

DEFENDANT'S RIGHTS: (Traffic Infractions)

DEFENDANTS HAVE THE FOLLOWING RIGHTS:

- I. Subpoena witnesses or records pertinent to the case (Subpoena forms are available at the clerk's office room 109J)
- 2. Request a court interpreter be provided
- 3. To obtain a court reporter at their own expense
- 4. To obtain an attorney at their own expense

DEFENDANTS "DO NOT" HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

- I. A Public Defender
- 2. A Jury Trial
- 3. A court reporter at county expense

EFFECTS OF THE TRIAL:

Defendant present:

- 1. Defendant may be found guilty
- 2. Defendant may be found not guilty
- 3. Defendant's case may be taken under submission, reviewed by the judge, and a decision mailed to the defendant.
- 4. The case may be dismissed

Defendant not present:

1) If the issuing officer is present and a trial is held, the defendant may be found guilty in absentia. Notification of this judgement will be mailed to the defendant. The defendant will have thirty (30) calendar days to file a Declaration and Motion To Vacate Judgment form with the clerk's office at room 109J. (forms may be obtained at room 109J)

If the motion is granted:

A new trial date is set and the defendant is notified by mail.

If the motion is denied:

The defendant is mailed a letter confirming or modifying the original judgment, based upon the content

of the defendant's motion.

2) If the issuing officer is also not present: The trial may be reset and the defendant will be mailed notification of the new trial date.

RESCHEDULING YOUR TRIAL DATE:

If the defendant or the officer can **show good cause** why they cannot make the trial date, the court may allow one reset each. Please contact the Traffic Court Trial Desk at 521-6684 **after 9:30 a.m.** for any information regarding trial resets. Any request for a trial reset must be at least ten (10) calendar days **before** the set trial date.
